

Whereas I James A. Crocker is indebted to William  
 Clinton to the amount of \$110.00 and desires to pay  
 him, Now this paper Witnesseth as follows, that I  
 hereby sell unto the said Wm. Clinton the following  
 personal estate to wit one bay horse one bed and  
 stead and all of my entire household and kitchen  
 furniture, all of my farming implements such  
 as plow, geese. But the said Clinton agrees that  
 he may retain possession of same property for 9  
 months from this date, and if I pay said Clinton  
 what I owe, that I may have the said Articles as  
 my own. Now this paper further Witnesseth that  
 in consideration of the above the said Crocker  
 hereby gives and grants unto the said Clinton a  
 lien upon all the crops of every kind that he  
 may make during the year 1880, with the exception  
 of one bale of cotton weighing 150 lbs. Witness

This Indenture tripartite, made the day of March  
 in the year 1880, between Henry Hamlin of the first  
 part, Eliza Gray of the second part and L. R. Edwards  
 of the third part. Whereas a marriage is shortly  
 intended to be had and solemnized by the permission  
 of God, by and between Henry Hamlin and Eliza  
 Gray, and whereas the said Henry Hamlin is  
 possessed of a personal estate, consisting of one  
 horse, one wagon and harness, three cows, ten  
 hogs, 2 Beds & furniture, one Sofa, one Bureau  
 six chairs, two Tables, two chests, cooking utensils  
 two plows and harness, two weeding hoes and one  
 put hoe, and whereas it hath been agreed, Henry  
 Hamlin should after the said marriage had, receive  
 and enjoy during the joint lives of them, the  
 said Henry Hamlin and Eliza Gray, the interest  
 and occupation of the said personal estate  
 and also that the same, and the interest and  
 profits from and after the decease of such of them  
 the said Henry Hamlin and Eliza Gray as  
 should first happen to die, should be at the sole and
