This Agreement entered into this the 23rd day of March 1880, between John W. Harrison, Merchant, of the one part and Joseph James of the other part Witnesseth: That the said Joseph James is about to engage in the cultivation of the soil and is desirous to obtain during the year 1880 advances in supplies from the said John W. Harrison to the amount of one hundred dollars beyond which limit the said Joseph James shall not go, and the said John W. Harrison having on his part agreed to furnish said advances, Now the said Joseph James on his part in consideration of the above premises does hereby grant a lien to the said John W. Harrison on the crops which may be made during the year 1880, upon the lands in cultivation of which the above amount of advances has been or was intended to have been expended. This Lien is granted under an Act of the General Assembly of Virginia approved April 2nd 1873 entitled "An Act to secure Advances for Agricultural Purposes" Witness the following signatures
