of P. Egan and Mary Ann his wife and J. B. Richardson
of the County of Southampton of the first part and
Fletcher S. Eggle of the County of the second part, (all of
the State of Virginia) Witnesseth that for and in
consideration of the sum of One hundred and
fifty dollars to them in hand paid by the said
Fletcher S. Eggle, the receipt whereof is here by acknowledged by the said parties of the first part, doth
both bargained, sold and conveyed and by these presents
Fletcher S. Eggle all of their right title and interest
with or without equity in the lands belonging to
the estate of Jacy Harwood deceased lying in the
County of Southampton and State of Virginia
and bounded as follows on the north by the
lands of Mrs. Prince, on the South by the lands
of the late Jacy Harwood, on the East by the lands of J. B. Richardson and
on the West by the lands of Thos. W. Applewhite, the
said interest of the parties of the first part being
their undivided share in the lands of Jacy Harwood
deceased, to have and to hold the said real
land to him the said Fletcher S. Eggle his heirs
