Wm. Beaton

This Agreement made this 17th day of June 1880
between W. M. Beaton of the part and J. E. Applewhite of the other part witnesseth that whereas the said John E. Applewhite is engaged in the cultivation of the soil and is desirous to obtain advances in supplies amounting to the amount of Sixty dollars from the said W. M. Beaton, beyond which limit the said John E. Applewhite shall not go, and the said W. M. Beaton having agreed on his part to furnish the said amount of advances now the said John E. Applewhite on his part in consideration of the above premises does grant a lien to the said W. M. Beaton on two thousand pounds of seed cotton, to be made this year 1880 on the land upon which the said advances were intended to have been expended.

This Lien is granted under an Act of the General Assembly of Virginia approved April 2nd 1873 "Entitled an Act to secure advances for Agricultural Purposes"

This Deed made the 23rd day of March in the year One thousand eight hundred and eighty, between Benjamin S. Bell of the first part and James C. Sykes of the second part witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of fifty dollars in hand paid, the said J. C. Sykes doth grant unto the said J. E. Sykes a certain lot of land lying in the County of Southampton bounded on the east by the S. M. & O. Rail Road and on all other sides by the land of the said B. S. Bell, and containing one acre more or less. The said grantor doth hereby forever release and quit claim unto the grantee, his heirs or assigns all right title and interest whatsoever both at law and Equity in and to the land and premises granted, so that neither he nor his personal representatives, his heirs or assigns shall at any time lawfully have, claim, challenge or demand
