Examd Whereas Caleb Everett a farmer of Southampton
 Virginia is planting a crop for the year 1880, and
 finds himself unable to cultivate and make the same without
 advances made to him in money, fertilizers and other
 necessary supplies, now therefore it is agreed between
 the said Caleb Everett of one part and Messrs. Norman
 and Everett of Baltimore, and Messrs. Darden and
 Myrick merchants of Southampton Virginia, in consideration
 of the sum of six thousand dollars advanced by Messrs.
 Norman and Everett and one hundred dollars advanced
 by Messrs. Darden and Myrick, in the shape of money, goods
 and fertilizers and supplies for the laborers of his
 farms that the said Caleb Everett doth grant a lien on
 all his crops of corn, cotton, field peas, pig roots
 wheat and all other crops of every kind now planted
 and growing or to be raised for this year 1880 on his
 two plantations in Southampton County, to Messrs.
 Norman and Everett to secure the sum of six
 thousand dollars and to Messrs. Darden and Myrick
 for one hundred dollars. As witness the following
 signature this 27th day of April 1880.
