

R. B. Pyle does hereby promise and agree to advance and furnish to the said Thos. McClellany & Thos. McClellany during the present year such monies, provisions, fertilizers and other supplies, not exceeding the sum of Fifty Dollars in amount, as may be needful to enable the said Thos. McClellany and Thos. McClellany to cultivate and gather his crops proposed to be made the present year, and the said Thos. McClellany & Thos. McClellany hereby gives and grants to the said R. B. Pyle a lien upon all such crops as he may make the present year, to wit: Corn, Paddy, Peas, Beans, Cotton and all other crops in order to secure the payment of such such supplies and advances as may be actually made, not exceeding the sum above stated. This Agreement is made in presence of an Act of the General Assembly of Virginia, passed April 2nd. 1872. I Witness, our hands this 1st day of May, 1880.

This Agreement entered into this 28th day of April 1880 between Jas. J. Darnen of the first part and Allen Banks ex. of the 2nd part witnesseth as follows, That whereas the said Allen Banks is about to engage in the cultivation of the soil and is desirous to obtain supplies during the year 1880 from the said Jas. J. Darnen for the amount of Forty Dollars and for having the acknowledgment and for securing this Agreement and the said Jas. J. Darnen having on his part agreed to furnish said supplies, Now the said Allen Banks on his part and in consideration of the said provisions doth hereby grant a Lien to the said Jas. J. Darnen on his crop of cotton to be made on Jack Packer's Land
