 fifty acres more or less, and is specially described by  
 metes and bounds and dimensions, in the said Deed of  
 Bargain & Sale, reference to which is hereby made as  
 part of this Deed. And the said parties of the second  
 part agree to hold the said real estate as Trustees forth-  
 comings and purposes in the said first mentioned Deed of Bargain  
 & Sale mentioned, that is to say, In Trust for the pur-  
 pose of a residence for the Minister and family and person-  
 age for the same, who may from time to time have charge  
 of the same, under the appointment of the Virginia Conference  
 of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, so to be held  
 by the said parties of the second part and their successor-  
 in Office, who may hereafter be appointed for that  
 purpose, in accordance with the Rules and Ordinan-  
 ces of said Church and the laws of the State of Virginia.
