This Indenture made the 10th day of February, one thousand eight hundred and Eighty, between H. H. Daughtry and Helen M^r his wife & C. C. Vaughan and Catherine his wife and J. G. Gay Administrator and Elizabeth S. Crompler widow of Joseph S. Crompler deceased, of the first part and Lewis Riddick son of the second part. Witnesseth; that the said H. H. Daughtry and Helen M^r his wife, C. C. Vaughan and Catherine his wife, and J. G. Gay administrator Joseph S. Crompler deceased for and in consideration of the sum of Eight Hundred Dollars paid in several installments, on and since May first one Thousand eight hundred and Sixty six by the said Lewis Riddick, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents doth grant, bargain and sell unto the said Lewis Riddick his heirs and assigns a certain parcel of Land, lying and being in the County of Southampton, State of Virginia, being a part of the tract known as Everett's Quarter purchased of John P. Kirby a signee in Bankruptcy of John D. Beale containing by survey Two hundred acre more or less and bounded as follows: beginning at the交 (sic) of a large Oak and Hickory, thence a line of reported two \$ 102° 6 22 poles to a small black gum in a ravine near a small poplar and gum, thence down the run of the ravine to a junction of two other ravines forming Crawford Branch, thence down said Branch along high water mark to a point opposite and near the original site of Deal and Monroe saw mill then low water mark along a ditch to the Nathaway River, thence down the river to the mouth of a Branch James M. Coulter line, thence up the run of said Branch for some distance and between a large poplar and white oak, thence along a new line of tree S.
