Daughtry and Helen M. his wife, L. Vaughan and Antoinette his wife, and J. P. Gay administrator Joseph J. Cornspler deceased for and in consideration of the sum of Eight thousand Dollars paid in several installments, one and since May first one thousand eight hundred and seventy five by the said Lewis Riddick, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell unto the said Lewis Riddick his heirs and assigns a certain parcel of Land, lying and being in the County of Southampton, State of Virginia, being a part of the tract known as Everett's Quarter, parcel of John B. Kilby, a piece in Manuscript of John B. Perkins, containing by survey Two hundred and more or less, and bounded as follows: beginning at a corner of and Hickory, thence a line of marked trees near a small poplar and gum, thence down the run of the ravine to a junction of two other ravines forming Crawford Branch, thence down said Branch along high water mark to a point opposite and near the original site of Deal and Moore's Saw Mill, thence low water mark along a ditch to the Nathany Cross, thence down the river to the mouth of a Branch James M.
