This Deed made this same day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty
C. Whitfield Augustus Crumpler and Mrs. Susan P. Crumpler his wife of the County of Southampton State of Virginia of the first part and George C. Whitfield of said County & State, of the second part, Witnesseth that in consideration of a sum of thirty five Dollars & fifty cents \$35.50 to them in hand paid by the said George C. Whitfield, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, they the said parties of the first part do grant, bargain, sell & convey unto the said George C. Whitfield all of that certain tract or parcel of land lying in Southampton County, Virginia bounded as follows, beginning at a pine in the Banner Line, the most northern station, thence 26 1/2 N 79° E chains to a white oak for a line S 20 1/2° W 430 chains to a Maple f. a. thence S 26 1/2° W 67 chains to a pine f. a. thence S 27 1/2° W 315 chains thence S 30 1/2° W 233 to the line a corner for Brown Land & a corner to Whitfield & Joseph J. Crumpler's est. thence S 7 1/2° E 1482 thence S 7 1/2° E 1167 chains to Sweet Gum S. E. thence S 7 1/2° E 97 links to black Gum a corner for Augustus Crumpler & Mrs. Susan P. Crumpler C. C. Whitfield's line, thence N. 29° W. a line of marked trees to the pine at the beginning containing eighteen and half 18 1/2 acres and the said Augustus Crumpler and Mrs. Susan P. Crumpler his wife of the first part, By this Present do covenant & forever quit claim to the property above named, as for the mistakes & risks, by these presents relinquishing their right forever in the property hereinbefore named.
