

This Agreement made and entered into the 15th day of July 1850 between Pope & Gillette, Merchants of the first part and W. P. Hay of the second. It is remembered that whereas the said W. P. Hay is engaged in the cultivation of the said land it desires to obtain supplies during the year 1850 from the said Pope & Gillette for the amount of seventy dollars and the said Pope & Gillette having agreed to furnish said supplies and in consideration of the above advances and promises, the said W. P. Hay does hereby grant notice to the said Pope & Gillette and the crops which may be raised during the year 1850 upon the land which the said W. P. Hay does cultivate or has cultivated by tenants for the amount of a bond advances. And it is further agreed by the said parties to this Agreement, that the crops above referred to is to be delivered to the said Pope & Gillette on or before the 15th day of December 1850.
