 April 1880 between Pope & Gillette Merchants of the

 supplies during the year 1880 from the said Pope
 & Gillette for the amount of Thirty Dollars, and
 the said Pope & Gillette having agreed to furnish said
 supplies and in consideration of the above advances &
 promise, the said Daniel Smith does hereby grant &
 give to the said Pope & Gillette on all the crops which
 may be raised during the year 1880 upon the land which
 the said Daniel Smith does cultivate or has
 cultivated, a lien for the amount of above
 advances, And it is further agreed by said parties
 to this Agreement that the crop above referred to is to
 be delivered to the said Pope & Gillette on or before the
 1st day of December 1880
