sum of fifty two (\$52.⁰⁰) Dollars in amount) as may be
needed to enable the said James Wilson to cultivate and
gather his crops proper to be made the present year.
And the said James Wilson hereby gives and grants
to the said P. H. Blythe, a lien upon all such crops as
he may make the present year, to wit: corn, Poddy, Peas,
Beans, cotton and all other crops, in order to secure
the payment for all such supplies and advances
as may be actually made, not exceeding the sum above
stated. This Agreement is made in pursuance of
an Act of the General Assembly of Virginia, approved
April 2nd, 1893. Witness our hands this 17th day of

Examd. **This Deed**, made this 2d day of April in the year one
thousand eight hundred and eighty between W. A. Bradshaw
& Martha Ann Bradshaw his wife of the first part, and
P. H. Jaynes & Georgeanna S. Jaynes & their children of the
second part, Witnesseth, that in consideration of the sum
of three hundred and no dollars the said W. A. Bradshaw
& Martha Ann Bradshaw do grant unto the said P. H. Jaynes
& Georgeanna S. Jaynes & their children with General
Warranty, all of a certain tract or parcel of land
known as the "Sand Tract" containing one hundred
and fifty acres more or less lying in the County of
Southampton, and bounded by the lands of Chas. S.
Tamm, the late P. L. Davis and Louisa Burges.
The said W. A. Bradshaw & Martha Ann Bradshaw
covenant that they have the right to convey the said
land to the grantee, that they have done no act to
encumber the said land, that the grantee shall
have quiet possession of the said land, free from
all encumbrances, and that they, said W. A. Brad-
shaw & Martha Ann Bradshaw parties of the first
part will execute such further assurances of the said
