This Agreement made and entered into this the 5th day of May 1880, between J. E. Bailey, of the first part and Britton Turner of the second part, witness as follows: That whereas the said Britton Turner is engaged in the cultivation of the soil and is desirous to obtain supplies of fertilizers during the year 1880 from the said J. E. Bailey for the amount of one hundred & fifty dollars and the said Bailey having agreed to furnish the said supplies, now the said Turner on his part and in consideration of the above advances & promises does hereby grant unto the said Bailey a Lien on all the crops that may be made during the year 1880 upon the lands that the said Turner cultivated for the value of above advances and cost of this Agreement.

It is furthermore agreed by the Parties to this Agreement that the said crops shall be delivered to the said Bailey on or before the first day of Dec. 1880 and that no part of said crops shall be sold until it is by and through the said Bailey until the agreement is satisfied.
