And the said Lehas Ricks hereby gives and grants to the said Barham & Turner a lien upon all such crops as he may make the present year, to wit corn, fodder, peas, beans, cotton and all other supplies, in order to secure the payment for all such supplies and advances as may be actually made, not exceeding the sum above stated. This Agreement is made in pursuance of an Act of the General Assembly of Virginia, approved April 29. 1873.

This Agreement made this 2nd day of May in the year 1880 between Henry Mason of the first part and Barham & Turner of the other part, both of the County of Southampton State of Virginia: Witnesseth as follows: It was the said Henry Mason engaged in or is about to engage in the cultivation of the soil, which the said Barham & Turner has agreed to do. Now this Agreement Witnesseth: That the said Barham & Turner do hereby promise and agree to advance and furnish to the said Henry Mason during the present year such monies, provisions, fertilizers and other supplies (not exceeding the sum of one Hundred dollars dollars in amount) as may be needed to enable the said Henry Mason to cultivate and gather his crops proposed to be made the present year. And the said Henry Mason hereby gives and grants to the said Barham & Turner a lien upon all such crops as he may make the present year, to wit corn, fodder, peas, beans, cotton and all other crops in order to secure the payment for all such supplies and advances as may be actually made not exceeding the sum above stated. This Agreement is made in pursuance of an Act of the General Assembly of Virginia, approved April 29. 1873.
