Now this Agreement Witnesseth: That the said Barbara & Turner do hereby promise and agree to advance and furnish to the said Richard Rich during the present year, such provisions, provisions, fertilizers, and other supplies (not exceeding the sum of Fifteen Dollars in amount) as may be necessary to enable the said Richard Rich to cultivate and gather his crops proposed to be made this present year. And the said Richard Rich hereby binds himself and grants to the said Barbara & Turner a lien upon all such crops as he may grow the present year to wit: Corn, Potatoes, Peas, Beans, &c. and all other crops in order to secure the payment for all such supplies; and advances not to be actually made, not exceeding the sum above stated. This Agreement is made in presence of an Act of the General Assembly of Virginia approved April 2. 1878. Witness our hands this 14th day of May 1880.
