

Dyler has in cultivation on his own account. In consideration whereof the said Hardy agrees to perform the duties of Servant for said Dyler during the year 1856 to cultivate the Corn & Potatoes, which the said Dyler has planted on his own account and to gather & prepare the same for market all under the control & direction of said Dyler, and the said Hardy agrees that should he be sent any advances in supplies or money beyond the \$20 that the said Dyler shall have a lien on his third of said crops to secure such advances, and shall have the right to retain such part of his third as may be necessary to pay for such advances. The said Hardy agrees that should he get sick or otherwise be unable or fail to perform his part of this Agreement, that the said Dyler shall have the right to supply such assistance as he may think necessary, and to pay for the same out of what may be due or coming to the said Hardy. And it is understood that in the duties of Servant the following services are specially to be performed, viz: to cut & haul all fire wood, to make fires, to feed & attend to the Stock and to do such other acts about the farm as the said Dyler may require. Island shall during the present year make certain advances to the said cultivator of the soil, which the said J. P. Island has agreed to do. Now this Agreement Witnesseth that the said J. P. Island does hereby promise and agree to advance and furnish to the said George W. Stewart
