

during the present year, such manure, provisions, fertilizers and other supplies not exceeding the sum of Thirty Dollars in amount, as may be needed to enable the said George H. Stewart to cultivate and gather his crops proposed to be made the present year. And the said George H. Stewart hereby gives and grants to the said J. P. Bland a lien upon all such crops as he may make the present year, to wit: Corn, Tobacco, Peas, Peanuts, Cotton and all other crops, in order to secure the payment for all such supplies and advances as may be actually made, not exceeding the sum above stated. This Agreement is made in presence of an Act of the General Assembly of Virginia, approved April 14, 1880.

This Agreement made this 22 day of June in the year 1880, between J. P. Bland of the first part and R. S. Lewis and his wife Lavinia Lewis of the other part, both of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia. Witnesseth as follows: Whereas the said R. S. Lewis and his wife is engaged in or is about to engage in the cultivation of the soil, and it is desired that the said J. P. Bland shall during the present year make certain advances to the said cultivator of the soil, which the said Bland has agreed to do. Now this Agreement Witnesseth, that the said J. P. Bland does hereby promise and agree to advance and furnish to the said R. S. Lewis and his wife during the present year, such manure, provisions, fertilizers and other supplies not exceeding the sum of Thirty five dollars in amount, as may be needed to enable the said Lewis and his wife to cultivate and gather their
