Know all men by these presents that I Hartwell Taylor of the County and State aforesaid, for and in consideration of the sum of Twenty five Dollars to me in hand paid, and the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do grant and convey, bargain, and sell to J. P. Leland my entire interest in the crops of Corn, Potatoes, Peas, Beans and Peas planted and being cultivated by me the present year, also my entire interest in one Bay Horse in the possession of Charles H. Blunt, and I further agree after said crops are harvested to deliver same to said J. P. Leland at his place of business in Jerusalem Va. Witness my hand and seal this 23^d day of June 1840
