This Agreement entered into this 21st day of June 1880 between Jas. J. Darden, of the first part and Moses Jones of the other part witnesses as follows: That whereas the said Moses Jones is about to engage in the cultivation of the soil, and is desirous to obtain supplies during the year 1880 from the said Jas. J. Darden, for the amount of Forty Dollars and for taking the acknowledgment and for recording this Agreement, and the said Jas. J. Darden having on his part agreed to furnish said supplies, Now the said ^{Moses} Jones on his part and in consideration of the above provisions doth hereby grant a Lien to the said Jas. J. Darden on his Crops of Cotton to be raised on ^{the} Southampton Land this year and the said Jones waives his homestead Exemptions as to this debt. For the amount advanced to him this year, which has been or was intended to have been expended and the said Jones binds himself agreeable to law, to deliver said Cotton above mentioned to Jas. J. Darden at Newson's Depot Valley or before the 1st day of Decr 1880. This Lien is granted under an Act of the General Assembly of Virginia approved April 20th 1873 entitled an Act to secure advances for Agricultural Purposes.
