Chapman does hereby sell to the said Niemyer, Eldredge & Brooks One Bay horse named Bob valued at Forty Dollars One bundle corn for Twelve Dollars, one Saw and six Sheats for Ten Dollars, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged And it is further agreed by the said parties to this Agreement that the book and property above referred to is to be delivered to the said Niemyer, Eldredge & Brooks on or before the 1st day of December 1880.
