This Agreement made this 22<sup>d</sup> day of June in the year 1860 between  
 B. B. Williams of the first part and Jacob Council of the  
 other part, both of the County of Southampton, State of  
 Virginia: Witnesseth as follows: That the said Jacob  
 Council is engaged in, or is about to engage in the cultivation  
 of the soil and is desirous that the said B. B. Williams  
 shall during the present year make certain advances to the said  
 cultivator of the soil, which the said B. B. Williams has agreed  
 to do. Now this Agreement Witnesseth, that the said  
 B. B. Williams does hereby promise and agree to advance  
 and furnish to the said Jacob Council, during the  
 present year, such manure, provisions, fertilizers and  
 other supplies, (not exceeding the sum of One Hundred  
 Dollars in amount) as may be needful to enable the  
 said Jacob Council to cultivate and gather his crops  
 proposed to be made the present year. And the said  
 Council hereby gives and grants to the said Williams, a  
 lien upon all such crops as he may make the present  
 year, to wit: corn, fodder, peas, beans, cotton and all  
 other crops, in order to secure the payment for all such  
 supplies and advances as may be actually made,  
 not exceeding the sum above stated. This Agreement  
 is made in pursuance of an act of the General  
 Assembly of Virginia, approved April 2nd, 1858.  
 Witness our hands this 22<sup>d</sup> day of June 1860.

Whereas Lawson Beale and Martha his wife, did by deed  
 dated March 19<sup>th</sup> 1844 convey unto George L. Driville of the  
 city of Portsmouth (Master) the following property to wit:  
 all of that tract or parcel of Land upon which the said  
 grantors now reside lying in said County and is supposed  
 to contain Seventy six acres by the same more or less, it  
 being the same tract which was granted to the said  
 Beale by Anthony Harris in the year 1822, bounded and  
 described as follows: on the North by the lands of  
 Nathan Thomas decd. East by Augustus Smith, on the South  
 by the lands of W. L. Joyner. Also all that tract of Land  
 which was owned by James Jackson in his life time  
 & on which he resided, containing Seven Hundred
