This Deed, made the 13th day of February in the year  
One thousand eight hundred and eighty, between Warren  
J. Elliott, Special Commissioner as hereinafter stated,  
Party of the first part and Atala Beale, thy wife of  
Joseph Beale of the city of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania,  
Party of the other part. Whereas by a decree  
entered on the 1st day of February in the year 1830  
in the Suit in Equity then and now pending in  
the Corporation Court of Norfolk City between  
Emma Blacknall and others Plaintiff and  
Wm. J. Peir, administrator of George Blodde deceased  
and others Defendants, partition was made, in  
part, of the lands belonging to the estate of George  
Blodde, deceased, among the parties entitled thereto,  
and the lands hereinbefore described were  
allotted to the said Atala Beale, the wife of  
said Joseph Beale, the being one of the heirs  
at law of the said George Blodde deceased, and  
by the same decree the said Warren J. Elliott  
Special Commissioner was directed to convey  
by deed the lands allotted to the several parties  
allotted thereto. Now Therefore this Deed  
Witnesseth that the said Warren J. Elliott Special  
Commissioner as aforesaid, in consideration  
of the premises and of Five Dollars to him in  
hand paid, and by virtue of the authority  
vested in him by the aforesaid decree, doth grant
