in consideration of the above advances, and  
promises the said George Story does hereby  
grant a lien to the said Benj. Howell on all  
the crops which may be made during the year  
1880 upon the land which the said George Story  
does cultivate or has cultivated by tenants  
for the sum of above advances. And it is  
further agreed by the said parties to this  
Agreement, that the crops above referred to,  
is to be delivered to the said Benj. Howell  
on or before the 25th day of December.
