This Agreement entered into this the 2nd day of July 1880 between W. M. Beaton Merchant doing business under the firm name of W. M. Beaton & Co. of one part and James H. Worrell of the other part. Witnesseth as follows: That whereas the said James H. Worrell is engaged in the cultivation of the soil, and is desirous to obtain during the year 1880 advances in supplies from the said W. M. Beaton to the amount of One Hundred and Seventy Five Dollars beyond which limit the said J. H. Worrell shall not go and the said W. M. Beaton & Co. having on their part agreed to furnish said advances, now the said J. H. Worrell on his part in consideration of the above premises does hereby grant a lien to the said W. M. Beaton & Co. upon the Crops of Cotton in cultivation of which the above amount of advances has been or was intended to have been expended. This lien is granted under the Act of the General Assembly of Virginia, approved Apr. 22nd 1873 entitled "An Act to secure advances for Agricultural Purposes".
