This Agreement made and entered into this the 15th day of July, 1880, between Wm M. Beaton trading under the firm name of Wm M. Beaton & Co of one part and Jot Holland and J. W. Holland of the other part Witnesseth: That whereas the said Jot Holland and his son J. W. Holland are engaged in the cultivation of the soil and are desirous of obtaining some advances in supplies to enable them to complete and harvest their crop for the year 1880 to the amount of one hundred & twenty five dollars, beyond which limit the said Jot Holland and J. W. Holland shall not go, and the said Wm M. Beaton having agreed on his part to furnish the said advances, now the said Jot Holland & J. W. Holland on their part in consideration of the above premises do hereby grant a lien to the said Wm M. Beaton on their crops which may be raised during the year 1880 upon the land in cultivation of which the above amount of advances has been or was intended to have been expended. This Lien is granted under an Act of the General Assembly of Virginia approved April 20th 1873 entitled "An Act to secure advances for Agricultural Purposes".
