Grand Ship Deed, made this 19th day of June 1880 between A. O. Byrd of the County of Giles of Wight and John Jenkins of the County of Southampton both of State of Virginia, grantors of the first part and John W. Lawrence of the County of Southampton State of Virginia, chosen as Trustee, of the second part. *See from* Witnesseth, that in order to secure one note payable by the said Byrd and Jenkins unto W. H. Jenkins & Co. they the said grantors do grant and convey unto the said John W. Lawrence, Trustee aforesaid, the entire crop of Peanuts consisting of 20 acres more or less, which they are cultivating on their farms in the said County of Southampton. In Trust, to secure the above mentioned debt payable and due unto the said W. H. Jenkins & Co. as follows to wit one note dated June 19th 1880 for \$300 Dollars due and payable by the said A. O. Byrd and John Jenkins, by & under the ^{firm} title of Byrd & Jenkins unto the said W. H. Jenkins & Co. the 1st day of Nov. 1880 said note being made by the said Byrd and Jenkins in consideration of supplies furnished by the said W. H. Jenkins & Co. from their Store in the Town of Franklin to assist the said grantors in cultivating their the said grantors crop during the present year. And the said Byrd and Jenkins bind themselves to deliver said crop of Peanuts to the said W. H. Jenkins & Co. by the 1st day of Nov. 1880.
