

E. m. v.

This Agreement made and entered into this the 19th day of June 1880, between J. E. Bailey of the first part and Bolling Kells of the second part Witnesseth as follows: that whereas the said J. E. Bailey is engaged in the cultivation of the soil and is desirous to obtain supplies, Fertilizers &c during the year 1880 from the said J. Bailey for the amt of Three Thousand Dollars, beyond that amt he shall not go, and the said J. Bailey having agreed to furnish the said supplies near the said Kells on his part and in consideration of the above advances & promises does hereby grant a Lien unto the said J. Bailey on all the crops that may be made during the year 1880 upon the lands that the said Kells cultivates for the amt. of the above advances & cost of this Agreement. It is furthermore agreed by the parties to this Agreement that the said crops shall be delivered to the said J. Bailey by or before the first day of Dec. 1880 and in case the said crops is not delivered at that time or enough of said crops to satisfy this Agreement then the said J. Bailey is empowered to employ labor, take charge, and gather said crops himself or enough of said crops to satisfy this Agreement and no more. It is specially agreed by the parties to this Agreement that no part of said crops shall be sold or carried away until it is by and through the consent of said J. Bailey unto this Agreement is satisfied. This Agreement is granted under an Act of the General Assembly of Virginia approved April 22nd 1873 entitled "an Act to secure advances for Agricultural Purposes."
