This Agreement made this 1st day of July in the
year 1880, between S. J. Partlow of the first part
and Geo. A. Applewhite of the other part both
of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia;
Witnesseth as follows: Whereas, the said
Geo. A. Applewhite is engaged in or is about
to engage in the cultivation of the soil, and is
desirous that the said S. J. Partlow shall
during the present year make certain advances
to the said cultivator of the soil, which the said
Partlow has agreed to do. Now this Agreement
Witnesseth, that the said S. J. Partlow
does hereby promise and agree to advance
and furnish to the said Applewhite during
the present year, such monies, provisions,
fertilizers and other supplies (not exceeding
the sum of Sixty Dollars in amount) as
may be needful to enable the said Geo. A.
Applewhite to cultivate and gather his crops
proposed to be made the present year.
And the said Applewhite hereby gives and
grants to the said Partlow a lien upon all
such crops as he may make the present year
to wit: Corn, Paddy, Peas, Potatoes, Cotton and
all other crops in order to secure the payments
for all such supplies and advances as
may be actually made, not exceeding
the sum above stated. This Agreement
is made in pursuance of an Act of the
General Assembly of Virginia approved
April 2, 1873. Witness our hands this 1st
day of July 1880.
