

John Wiggins is engaged in or is about to engage in the cultivation of the soil, and is desirous that the said Barham & Turner shall during the present year make certain advances to the said cultivator of the soil, which the said Barham & Turner has agreed to do. Now this Agreement Witnesseth That the said Barham & Turner does hereby promise and agree to advance and furnish to the said John H. Wiggins during the present year, such monies provisions, fertilizer, and other supplies (not exceeding the sum of \$100) (30) Dollars in amount) as may be needed to enable the said John H. Wiggins to cultivate and gather his crop proposed to be made the present year.

And the said John H. Wiggins hereby gives and grants to the said Barham & Turner a Lien upon all such crops as he may on or in the present year, to wit: Corn, Hoes, Peas, Potatoes, Cotton and all other crops and one Roan Mare Muttie, in order to secure the payment for all such supplies and advances as may be actually made, not exceeding the sum above stated. This Agreement is made in pursuance of an Act of the General Assembly of Virginia, approved April 2, 1873.
