

cultivator of the soil, which the said Barham & Turner has agreed to do. Now this Agreement Witnesseth: That the said Barham & Turner does hereby promise and agree to advance and furnish to the said Hamilton Diggs during the present year such monies, provisions, fertilizers and other supplies (not exceeding the sum of ten (10) dollars in amount) as may be needful to enable the said Hamilton Diggs to cultivate and gather his crops proposed to be made the present year.

And the said Hamilton ^{marked upon} gives and grants to the said Barham & Darnes a lien upon all such crops as he may make the present year to wit: corn, fodder, peas, peanuts, cotton and all other crops in order to secure the payment for all such supplies and advances as may be actually made not exceeding the sum above stated.

This Agreement is made in pursuance of an Act of the General Assembly of Virginia approved April 2 - 1873 -
