Barham & Turner

This Agreement made this 29 day of May in the year 1880 between Daniel Smith of the first part and Barham & Turner of the other part both of the County of Southampton State of Virginia: Witnesseth as follows: Whereas the said Daniel Smith is engaged in, or is about to engage in the cultivation of the soil, and is desirous that the said Barham & Turner shall during the present year make certain advances to the said Cultivation of the soil, which the said Barham & Turner has agreed to do.

Now this Agreement Witnesseth: That the said Barham & Turner do hereby promise and agree to advance and furnish to the said Daniel Smith during the present year such monies, provisions, fertilizers and other supplies (not exceeding the sum of twenty dollars, dollars in amount) as may be needed to enable the said Daniel Smith to cultivate and gather his crops proposed to be made the present year. And the said Daniel Smith hereby gives and grants to the said Barham & Turner a lien upon all such crops as he may make the present year, to wit: Corn, Fodder, Hay, Peanuts, Cotton, and all other crops, in order to secure the payment for all such supplies and advances as may be actually made, not exceeding the sum above stated.

This Agreement is made in pursuance of an Act of the General Assembly of Virginia approved April 2, 1873. Witness our hands this 29 day of May 1880.
