Now this Agreement Witnesseth: That the said Barham & Turner do hereby promise and agree to advance and furnish to the said Joseph Mason during the present year such monies, provisions, fertilizers and other supplies (not exceeding the sum of \$1500) fifteen dollars (dollars in amount) as may be used and paid to enable the said Joseph Mason to cultivate and gather his crops proposed to be made the present year. And the said Joseph Mason hereby gives and grants to the said Barham & Turner a lien upon all such crops as he may make the present year, to wit: corn, fodder, peas, peanuts, cotton and all other crops, in order to secure the payment for all such supplies and advances as may be actually made, not exceeding the sum above stated. This Agreement is made in pursuance of an Act of the General Assembly of Virginia approved April 2, 1873. Witness our hand this 13th day of July 1880.
