This Agreement made this 6 day of August in the year 1880, between James Artois of the first part, and Barham & Turner, of the other part, both of the County of Southampton State of Virginia. Witnesseth as follows.

Whereas, the said James Artois is engaged in or is about to engage in the cultivation of the said, and is desirous that the said Barham & Turner shall during the present year make certain advances to the said cultivation of the said, which the said Barham & Turner has agreed to do. Now this Agreement Witnesseth, That the said Barham & Turner does hereby promise and agree to advance and furnish to the said James Artois during the present year such monies, provisions, fertilizers and other supplies (not exceeding the sum of Ten dollars \$10- dollars in amount) as may be needed to enable the said James Artois to cultivate and gather his crops proposed to be made the present year. And the said James Artois hereby gives and grants to the said Barham & Turner a Lien upon all such crops as he may make the present year, to wit: Corn, Paddy, Peas, Beans, Cotton and all other crops, in order to secure the payment for all such supplies and advances as may be actually made, not exceeding the sum above stated.

This Agreement is made in pursuance of an Act of the General Assembly of Virginia approved April 2, 1873.
