This Agreement made this 28th day of April in the year 1880. between Barham & Turner of the first part and Henry Hall of the other part, both of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia. Witnesseth as follows: Whereas the said Henry Hall is engaged, in, or is about to engage in the cultivation of the soil, and is desirous that the said Barham & Turner shall during the present year make certain advances to the said cultivator of the soil, which the said Henry Hall has agreed to do, Now this Agreement Witnesseth: That the said Barham & Turner does hereby promise and agree to advance and furnish to the said Henry Hall during the present year, such moneys, provisions, fertilizers and other supplies (not exceeding the sum of Twenty-five Dollars in amount) as may be necessary to enable the said Henry Hall to cultivate and gather his crops proposed to be made the present year. And the said Henry Hall hereby gives and grants to the said Barham & Turner, a lien upon all such crops as he may make the present year, to wit: Corn, Hopper, Peas, Peanuts, cotton and all other crops in order to secure the payment for all such supplies and advances as may be actually made, not exceeding the sum above stated. This Agreement is made in presence of an Act of the General Assembly of Virginia, approved April 2, 1873. Witness our hands this 28th day of April 1880.
