

soil, and is desirous to obtain that the said Barham & Turner shall during the present year make certain advances to the said cultivator of the soil, which the said Barham & Turner has agreed to do.

Now this Agreement Witnesseth: That the said Barham & Turner do hereby promise, and agree to advance, and furnish to the said Mathew Mumford, during the present year such manure, provisions, fertilizers, and other supplies (not exceeding the sum of Twenty Five Dollars in amount) as may be needed to enable the said Mathew Mumford to cultivate and gather his crops proposed to be made the present year. And the said Mathew Mumford thereby gives and grants unto the said Barham & Turner, as Lien upon all such crops as he may make the present year, to wit: Corn, Paddy, Peas, Peanuts, cotton and all other crops, in order to secure the payment for all such supplies and advances as may be actually made, not exceeding the sum above stated.

This Agreement is made in pursuance of an Act of the General Assembly of Virginia, approved April 2, 1873.
