This Agreement entered into between Mary Story of the first part and Richard E. Story of the second part are of Southampton County and State of Virginia. Witnesseth that the said Mary Story has agreed that the said R. E. Story may build him a House to live in and Two Shops near Dick's Church at his own expense and the said R. E. Story shall have the free use of the three Houses above mentioned upon the following conditions: that he is not to sell or allow Spirituous Liquors to be sold at the Place, and the said R. E. Story shall have the Houses and a yard as long as the said R. E. Story lives or chooses to use the houses for his own use, but if he should die or cease to use the Houses and leave them then the House is to revert back to Mary Story or to who ever owned that part of Mary Story's land.
