

This 9<sup>th</sup> day of April 1880, between  
 Richard A. Clayton of the first part, of the County of  
 Isle of Wight & State of Virginia, and J. G. Scoring of  
 the County of Southampton and State aforesaid of the  
 second part, witnesseth: That the said party of the first  
 part, for and in consideration of the sum of One  
 hundred and fifty dollars paid to him by the said  
 party of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby  
 acknowledged, doth sell and convey with general  
 warranty to the said party of the second part all of  
 his right, title and interest (being two thirds) in and  
 to all the crops of Corn, fodder, and Peanuts now  
 growing or to be grown during the year 1880, on the  
 lands of James D. Barbour known as the "Blackwater  
 field" in the County of Southampton and it is hereby  
 covenanted and agreed that after the payment in full  
 of the said \$150<sup>00</sup> with all costs and interest out of  
 the interest in said crops hereby sold & conveyed, that  
 any surplus that may remain is to be paid over to the  
 said party of the first part his heirs or assigns.
