Pope his wife & the children & heirs may have by him of the second part Witnesseth that for & in consideration of the natural love and affection which the said parties of the first part has for the parties of the second part & for other good reasons, the said P. P. Pope does hereby give grant unto the parties of the second part with Special Warranty all of a certain tract or parcel of land lying in Southampton County known as the "Stony Place" containing seven hundred acres more or less & bounded by the lands of P. P. Pope & of Jas. Leagdale together with all his interest in a certain other tract known as the "Whitfield Place" (which he owns jointly with one Parker D. Stony)
