unto the parties of the second part with General  
Warren all of a certain tract or parcels of land

"Stony Place" containing seven hundred acres  
more or less & bounded by the lands of P. P. Pope  
& of Jas. Leggdale together with all his interest in a  
certain other tract known as the "Old field Place"  
(which he owns jointly with one Parker & Stony)
