 James H. Edwards of the County of Southampton State
 of Virginia of the first part grantor, and S. L. Gardner of
 the same County and State of the second part, chosen
 as Trustee, witnesseth: That the said James H. Edwards
 doth grant and convey for the purpose of securing
 one debt due John Butcher to with General Warranty
 unto the said S. L. Gardner the following real property
 to wit: a certain parcel a lot of land lying in the
 Town of Franklin and bounded as follows:
 Beginning at a white oak a corner of this tract and the
 lands of Ephie David Howell died seized and
