B. Putlow and whereas the said Bond has been fully paid, and evidenced by the said J. B. Putlow signing and sealing this present, and whereas the said A. A. Holland is entitled to and desires a recovery and of the aforesaid real estate free and discharged from the lien aforesaid. Now this Deed made this 5th day of October Eighteen Hundred and Eighty between J. D. Putlow Trustee and J. B. Putlow of the one part and A. A. Holland of the other part Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the above facts, the party of the first part doth grant and convey to the said A. A. Holland the above mentioned real Estate free and discharged from the lien of the aforesaid Court Deed.

Whereas the Legislature of Virginia has by Law authorized all persons who are Householders and heads of families by Deed to set aside certain Property to be held as a Homestead for the benefit of themselves, wives and children. Now Therefore I Wm. H. Coggesdale of Southampton County and State of Virginia do hereby by Deed set aside the following property, first all my interest in a certain tract of land lying in Southampton County containing Eighty Acres, the said Land being now conveyed under a Deed of Trust to J. B. Putlow Trustee to secure a certain Debt of James L. Coggesdale my son-in-law being \$300 in value, all my crops of Corn, Potatoes and Peanuts grown this year 1880 value \$200.
