

to perform his part of this Agreement, then said Kinchen Gray & Martha his wife, or either of them reserves the right to assume control & possession of the above described property & to dispose of it as they may see fit by giving said E. P. Land 20 days notice in writing of their intention so to do. But if the said Martha Gray wife of Kinchen Gray, should be the survivor & should desire at any time, during her widowhood, to claim her Power in the above described real estate, then liberty is hereby granted her to do so. But the said Power interest is to be for example to said E. P. Land, at her death. And if she should at that exercise the above mentioned privilege, then the said E. P. Land is released & absolved from making the provision as aforesaid for her.
