Whereas, by the Last Will & Testament of our Esq'r
 Anguhart, certain property was devised to the wife of his
 son A.B. Anguhart & Jas H. Anguhart was left as Trustee for
 holding said property, & whereas the said Jas H. Anguhart
 has refused to accept the said Trust, & A.B. Anguhart has
 been substituted in his stead, by an order of the
 County Court of Southampton & whereas certain

Dates have been realized from the sale of the real
 estate of the said E. B. Anguhart, which said monies are
 part thereof belong to the wife of said A.B. Anguhart
 & whereas, by order of the County Court of Southampton,
 entered at the December Term 1871, in the Chancery
 suit of Anguhart vs Anguhart Trustee, it was
 decided that A.B. Anguhart Trustee for his wife
 E. A. Anguhart, invest as much of the funds
 in his hands, as said Trustee may be
 necessary to pay for the tract of land in the
 proceedings mentioned, & whereas said tract
 of land was and purchased, by said A.B. Anguhart
 Trustee as an investment of the monies before
 mentioned, & whereas a deed was made by D.S.
 Morgan & wife, conveying said property erroneously
 to said A.B. Anguhart Trustee in trust for his said wife
 & children & the children of any other wife he
 may take, & whereas a decree was entered at the
 May Term 1879, of the Circuit Court of Southampton,
 directing said Deed from D.S. Morgan & wife
 to A.B. Anguhart Trustee, to be set aside, and
 another deed made conveying said real estate
 in accordance with the Will of Mrs. E.B. Anguhart.
 Now therefore this deed made this 9th day of
 September 1879 between D.S. Morgan & wife
 his wife, of the first part & A.B. Anguhart Trustee
 of the second part witnesseth, that for the consideration
 of the premises & the sum of Twelve hundred
 Dollars to them in hand paid, receipt whereof
 is hereby acknowledged, the said parties of the
 first part do grant & convey to the parties of the
 second part the said A.B. Anguhart Trustee with
 general warranty, a certain tract or parcel of
 Land, situated & being in the County of Southam-
 ptown, known as "Retreat", containing 338 acres
 more or less & bounded by the lands of Mary &
 Adkins - Mrs. A. Spain's estate & others, to have &
 hold the said tract of land, his heirs & assigns
 forever - upon trust, that the said Trustee will
 allow Eliza A. Anguhart his wife, to occupy
 peaceful & enjoy said tract of land free from
 all manner of charge & incumbrance of said
