I know all men by these presents, that I ^{Wm} Gay of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia, for and in consideration of the sum of ^{Five} hundred and fourteen Dollars, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, have sold and by these presents do bargain and sell to J. J. Woodard all of the unsold part of my present crop which I made on the land of Wm. A. Powell, consisting of 45 Bbl. long corn 8 Bbl. short corn, 100 bushels Sweet Potatoes, 3500 a fodder, 2 hens, Shucks, 400 lb. Seed Cotton & 1200 a Seed Cotton in patch on one only of less my Stock of Horses, Cows, Hogs, Vehicles, Farming implements and household and Kitchen furniture, consisting of 1 Horse and Mule, Seven Head of Cattle, 9 head of Hogs, two Carts & wheels, one buggy & harness, four plows, two sets plow gear, two pitch forks, two shovels, four weed hoes, four axes, three Beds and furniture, one sitting chair, one Rocking Chair, two tables, one clock, one double shot gun, one single shot gun, 1 Din. Sofa and all cooking utensils. The right and title of which I demand and defend, to the said J. J. Woodard, against myself and the lawful claims of all persons.
