

This Deed, made this 12th day of November in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty between Catharine Stephenson of the first part and William Stephenson of the second part: It witnesseth, that, in consideration of the ~~same~~ natural affection she bears him, the said Catharine Stephenson does grant unto the said William Stephenson and his heirs forever with General Warranty all her right, title, and interest in the sum of \$609⁰⁰ Six hundred and nine dollars and seventy five cents amount of arrears for support of said Catharine adjudged by the Circuit Court of Southampton County and also her right, title and interest in the \$50⁰⁰ Fifty dollars per annum amount allowed said Catharine Stephenson for annual support, commencing from the 1st day of October 1879, and running to the 1st day of October 1880 (the allowance for the first year and no more). The said Catharine Stephenson covenants that she has the right to convey the said property to the grantee, that she has done no act to encumber the said property that the grantee shall have quiet possession of the said property free from all encumbrances, and that the said Catharine Stephenson party of the first part will execute such further assurances of the said gift as may be requisite. Witness the following signature of said Catharine Stephenson.
