 That for and in consideration of the sum of \$1000.
 One thousand dollars, \$500. five hundred dollars to
 John T. Wills and Mary E. Wills his wife, and \$500. five
 hundred dollars to R. J. Williams and Margaret A.
 Williams, his wife, the above named parties John T.
 Wills and Mary E. Wills his wife and R. J. Williams
 and Margaret A. Williams, his wife, of the first
 mentioned part do grant unto and hereby convey all
 their right title, and interest in the Estate (both real
 and personal) of Thos. J. Bristow, deceased, also all
 their right title and interest in the portions of said
 estate bequeathed to Martha A. Bristow by said
 Thos. J. Bristow in his last Will and Testament - to
 the above named party R. J. Bristow, of the other
 part mentioned, to him and his heirs forever, with
 General Warranty, Witness our hands and seals
 the day and date aforesaid.
