 year one thousand, eight hundred and eighty
 between Mathew Broadshaw wife of the first part,
 and George W. Raiford of the second part,
 Witnesseth, that in consideration of the sum of
 100⁰⁰ One hundred Dollars the said Mathew
 Broadshaw & Patsy his wife do grant unto the said
 George W. Raiford with General Warranty, all
 of a certain piece or parcel of land (formerly
 a part of the Common Kitchen Tract) containing
 (15) fifteen acres more or less and bounded by the
 land of Mills E. Raiford on the north and
 George W. Raiford on the south, East and West
 to him and his heirs forever. The said Mathew
 Broadshaw & wife covenant that they have the right
 to convey the said land to the grantee, that they have
 done no act to encumber the said land, that the
 grantee shall have quiet possession of the said
 land free from all encumbrances, and that they
 Mathew Broadshaw & Patsy Broadshaw parties of the
 first part, will execute such further assurances of
 the said land as may be requisite.
