This agreement made this 1st day of April in the year 1890, between A. J. Jeyner of the first part and Robert Conley of the other part, both of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia, Witness the following, to-wit: Whereas the said Robert Conley is engaged in, or is about to engage in the cultivation of the soil, and as advised that the said A. J. Jeyner shall during the present year advance to the said cultivation of the soil, which the said A. J. Jeyner has agreed to do, so that his agreement is to-wit: that the said A. J. Jeyner does hereby promise and agree to advance and furnish to, said Robert Conley during the present year, such monies, provisions, fertilizers and other supplies not exceeding the sum of one hundred & fifty dollars or \$50 dollars in amount, as may be needed to enable the said Robert Conley to cultivate and gather his crop proposed to be made the present year, and the said Robert Conley gives and grants to the said A. J. Jeyner a lien upon all such crops as he may make the present year to-wit: Corn, Potatoes, Peas, Bananas, Cotton and all other crops, and to receive the payment for all such supplies and advances as may be actually made, not exceeding the sum so stated. This agreement is made in pursuance of Act of the General Assembly of Virginia, approved April 2nd 1890, in witness whereof, our hands this 1st day of April, 1890.
