As it has come to all whom it may concern that I have this day sold to
 Robert Pope all my crops, now on his land such as cotton corn, fodder
 + Potatoes, Beans, &c. &c. all of my entire crops for \$16.00 this
 being the amount I owe him for Providence House want to do
 to the same now or here on conditions, that said R. P. Pope is to pay to
 Barham Turner thirty dollars this being the amount of loan given them
 on my crops the present year by me, he further on promises to give
 me other \$10 dollars worth of fodder this being what the poor law allows me
 he further now promises and agrees to give me one on all corn &c. &c. most
 which he promises to save and deliver all of said crops to him, in case I should
 fail to save and deliver all of said crops to said R. P. Pope now on his lands
 made by me, I will then claim no poor law, but give said R. P. Pope all of
 my crops, made by me on his land the present year, for the payment
 of the above debt. I furthermore claim that said R. P. Pope has promised
 and agreed, when I shall save and deliver all of said crops to
 him that he will receipt to me in full of all at date, given under my
 hand and seal in pursuance of this contract this 17th day of Nov. A.D. 1880
